Renter's Credit

What is changing?

- Beginning in 2025, claim Renter's Credit on Minnesota Individual Income Tax (Form M1)
 - Refundable
 - Part of amount owed or refund
- Renters no longer receive separate refund later in year
- Form M1PR updated

Schedule M1RENT

New form: Schedule M1RENT

Certificate of Rent Paid

Schedule M1RENT

Schedule M1REF

Form M1

Important Reminders

- •Renter's claim credit using Form M1, not Form M1PR
- Still use your Certificate of Rent Paid (CRP)
- No separate refund
- •2023 returns and amending previous returns: use previous forms

Informational Letter

We will send you a letter if in the past two years you:

- •Filed a Minnesota Property Tax Refund (M1PR) as a renter
- Did not file a Minnesota
 Income Tax return (Form M1)



Information for Homeowners

- •Still file on Form M1PR
- Reworked how additional non-taxable income is reported
- Special Refund calculation moved to Schedule M1PR-SR, Special Refund

Property Owner and Managing Agent Requirements

- Must issue CRPs to tenants if either apply:
 - Property tax was payable on property in 2024
 - You made payments in lieu of property taxes
- Must issue one CRP to each adult renter by January 31, 2025

Who Gets a CRP?

- Adult renters
- Adult roommates and married couples receive separate CRPs
 - One name on each CRP
 - CRPs must show rent split equally

Important Dates and Penalties

- Issue CRPs no later than January 31
- Keep copies of CRPs for four years, until February 1, 2028, for 2024 CRPs
- •Penalties:
 - For CRP not issued when required: \$100
 - For overstated rent: Larger of \$100 or 50% of overstated amount

Program Changes

2016 Process Review

- Free filing available to homeowners through e-Services
 - County tax statements provide verification
- Owners and agents required to submit CRPs to tenants

Project Goals

- Obtain CRP information from owners and agents
- Allow renters to use e-Services as free filing option

CRP Project Timeline: Where Have We Been?

2017

 New law allowing Revenue to require owners and agents to submit copies of CRPs to us

2019

 Revenue launches new feature in e-Services allowing business customers to submit CRPs

CRP Project Timeline: Where Have We Been?

2021

 New law allowing Revenue to require Taxpayer ID during registration process

2023

- Revenue launches new feature in e-Services allowing individuals to register to submit CRPs
- No requirement to use e-Services to create and submit CRPs

CRP Project Timeline: Where Are We Going?

2024

- Revenue transitions Renter's Credit to Form M1, Individual Income Tax return
- Using e-Services to create CRPs still optional

2025

- Rent credit claimed on Form M1
- Property owners and managing agents required to use
 e-Services to submit 2024 CRPs to Revenue

Updates for Property Owners and Managing Agents

- •Beginning in 2025, all CRPs must be generated in e-Services
- If you are required to provide a CRP, you must be registered to use e-Services
- Alternate process exists

TAX PREPARATION 2025 Tax Season

Largest Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) Site in MN

- IRS-certified Volunteers
- Tax Preparers complete 20 hours of training
- Over 400 Volunteers
- Individuals making under \$40,000, Families under \$70,000
 - Federal and State Returns
 - Property tax returns
 - Prior year returns (back to 2019)
 - Self-employement returns
 - Apply/Renew ITIN (Individual Tax Identification Number)



 - Urban League TC, Minneapolis
 - Eastside Neighborhood Services, Minneapolis
 - Green Central Elementary, Minneapolis
 - CAPI USA, Brooklyn Center
 - VEAP, Bloomington
 - Neighbors Inc, Crecimiento Latino (Culturally Specific)
- Summer Tax Clinic: Mid July Mid August
 - Main Office Lower Level
- Fall Tax Clinic: Mid September October
 - Main Office Lower Level





TAX PREPARATION Special Tax Programs

Do-It-Yourself Tax Prep (DIY)

- Online software
- P+P Support

Self-Employment

- Independent Contractor or Sole Proprietor w/ self-employment income over \$10,000
- Download and complete SETO prior to appointment

Individual Tax Identification Number (ITIN)

- P+P Certified Acceptance Agents
- New or Renew ITIN





TAX PREPARATION

Connecting with free tax assistance

- Appointments available starting January 15th
- Tax season starts on January 25th for P+P
- Schedule online or by phone

- Free tax prep sites available across Minnesota
- Minnesota Revenue website has a site finder tool
 - https://www.revenue.state.mn.us/free-tax-preparation-sites





Renter's: Be Prepared

- Have all of your CRPs in place before you file your taxes
- If you are missing one or all your CRPs when you file, you will have to file an amended return (Form M1X)
- Amended returns can be complicated to complete and state
 amendments must be mailed in resulting in long processing times





Property owners:

- Providing timely and correct CRPs is now even more important for a full and complete tax filing for your tenants
- Minnesota Revenue website has guidance and instruction on how to properly complete the forms
- The CRP may still ask about "Housing Support (formerly known as GRH)", be aware that this question is about a specific program





Recap for renters

- Refund will be combined with your state
- Renter's Credit refund timeline is changing
 - Will be processed right after filing state return
 - A separate refund will NOT be sent in the summer
- Have all of your CRPs ready when filing
- These changes do not apply to homeowners property tax refund
